This study session will recount the experience of Jews as garment workers and will also examine today's labor movement. Our speaker will be Jacob Schlitt, an immigrant and garment industry labor organizer. Come to learn stories and values you can share at your own Passover seder.



Jacob Schlitt has spent most of his career in the areas of organized labor, civil rights and Jewish community relations. He has worked for organizations as varied as the International Ladies Garment Workers, Jewish Labor Committee, US Commission on Civil Rights and the Massachusetts Attorney General's Fair Labor Division. He continues to be active with the New England Jewish Labor Committee and the Boston Workmen's Circle.

Mr. Schlitt will share with us his immigrant mother's story of working the sweatshops of New York's lower east side and will discuss the many parallels between our Passover celebration of Exodus and workers' struggles for decent wages and job security.
